## 15 Tips for Better Pet Photos

# Dress Comfortably

Shooting pets requires the ability to move quickly and get low to the ground. Wear loose clothing and good shoes.

#### **Get On Their Level**

Avoid image distortion by photographing your pets at their eye level. Get down low, or place a smaller animal higher up on a table, bench, etc.

#### Move

Step a little to the right or left to check out various angles. Take shots along the way. Magic happens with the slightest adjutments at times.

#### **Steady Hand**

Ditch the tripod and monopod to keep up with the action, but use a steady hand to avoid blur. Image stabilization lenses are awesome for this.

#### **Be Patient**

Communication barriers prevent directing the pet on how to pose. Pay attention and wait to

## Focus on Eyes

Images of animals are always improved by getting their eyes in sharp focus. Capture their essence by focusing on the eyes.

#### **Anticipate Action**

You cannot ask a pet to make adjustments for a better angle. You can, however, read body loanguage and plan your shots accordingly.

#### **Capture Attention**

Make strange noises, call the pets name or use a trigger word such as "treat" to get the pet to look toward the camera.

#### **Use Treats**

You can use treats to get pets to move directions you wan them to go. Just be prepared for slobbery pet kisses and soggy lenses.

#### Have a Helper

Having an assistant allows you to manage the camera while someone else manages the pet. Besides, it's more fun to have company.

# Create Bokeh

Blur the background to focus on your pet. Use a telephoto lens and put your pet midway between you and the background. Wide apertures help.

#### Find the Light

Early morning, late evening, cloudy days, or shady areas work best for pet photos. Avoid harsh sunlight and flash photography.

#### **Take Burst Photos**

Take a series of 10 to 15 images by holding down the camera shutter button. This helps capture the fast action and fleeting expressions.

### Check Background

Pay attention to what is behind your pet. Pets with trees growing out of their head may look funny, but it could also ruin a great image.

## **Print Hard Copies**

Cameras break and technology advances. Be sure to print out some of your best images every month or two. Don't lose precious keepsakes.
